Mandala Theatre Company is looking for a Technical Company Stage Manager to support their Arts Council funded production of 'Though This Be Madness' written by Avaes Mohammad and directed by Yasmin Sidhwa. To find out more about the production, please see the information included in this pack.

As Technical Company Stage Manager you will:

- Adapt the book and create technical riders for the production.
- Assist in rehearsals.
- Record, download and run sound in rehearsals.
- Liaise with venues to ensure they have all the technical information they need and that all our technical requirements will be met.
- Setup and get out the staging and sound equipment for performances (with assistance from the rest of the company).
- Run the show during performances.
- Assist venue technician with pre-rig and focussing of lights and ensure sound and light are ready for the show to run.
- Undertake any other reasonable duties at the request of the Artistic Director.
- Be responsible for driving the tour van to and from venues and to accommodation as well as and planning routes to and from venues and accommodation

Though this be Madness is the 3rd part of our trilogy Place, Identity and Belonging building on a successful ACE funded Castaways Tour, which resulted in a national 17-city tour in 2018

Plugged into headphones - a world of spoken word, music, podcasts and rap that underscores their lives. Tachia, Cass and Mickey have ended up outside the mainstream, labelled, boxed in. Can they escape this life and find a way out or will they get drawn into the dangers lurking, waiting to pounce on the vulnerable and isolated?

Though this be Madness unravels what is happening to young people in relation to education, exclusion, criminal exploitation and too often, research reveals, an exclusion to prison pipeline. "42% of those in British prisons were excluded from school as children". Our story examines what is happening in our education and prison systems when "Pupils excluded from school at 12 are four times as likely as other children to be jailed as adults". What is happening to children from the poorest families or those who are 'Cared for' when they are four times more likely to be excluded from school?
